

Victor Pearson, a Vietnam war hero, spent three decades in the Philippines. He had sex with hundreds of women. In 2001, he was charged with over 80 counts of rape.

In 1969, an American Vietnam war hero relocates to a remote village in the Philippines and invites hundreds of women to live with him in his compound. Through money and violence, he was able to rule like a king. "It was like Christmas and birthday and holiday all rolled into one", he recalls proudly.

In 2002 he is charged with 80 counts of rape.

Victor Pearson is now in jail serving two life sentences, but many of the women remain by his side. Pearson and his harem form an extended family bound together by codependency and power issues. Although still behind bars, he has since married five of the women who testified against him in court, keeping them in apartments in the neighbourhood.

Unrepentant, Victor Pearson is a charismatic character who lived his dream. When confronted with his abuse of girls as young as 14, he claims that the lifestyle and education he provided these women with outweigh the charges leveled at him.

"Kano" is the fascinating story of a convicted rapist and the women who come together to form a most dysfunctional family.
